If the child's dad is unable to attend they are welcome to bring another adult instead.




Class photos

Nursery sports and teddy bears picnic

On Wednesday 27th June we will be holding a nursery sports event, followed by a teddy bears picnic.

We will be starting the races at 11am. All nursery children are invited, as are family and friends. Entry will be via the Fieldmice gate from 10.50am.

The children will need to bring along a teddy that will fit in a drawer (like the ones they put their belongings in). They will also need to come dressed in appropriate clothing, including trainers or plimsolls. After the races we will have a teddy bears picnic - families will need to provide their own picnics and blankets but we will be selling cakes, with any profits going back into the nursery classes. If you would like to donate any cakes please bring them along on the day.



Personal hygiene

If your child is in pull-ups / nappies please can you ensure you sent them in with enough for the time they are with us, plus wipes and nappy sacks.

We also suggest that your child has their own spare clothes in school. We do have some spare items, but stocks of these are running low. If your child needs spare clothes and there are no suitable items in school we will have to contact you to bring some in.

If your child borrows items we would be grateful if they could be returned as soon as possible.



Summer weather

A reminder of the information sent out last half term:

Please could you make sure your child has a sun hat in school at all times. If it is a very sunny day they will not be allowed outside without one, including in our outdoor areas.

We also encourage you to apply sun cream to your child before they come to school. If you are concerned that your child will need to have sun cream reapplied during the school day, then you can supply sun cream for your child (labelled with your child's name) that staff will apply when required, such as after playing in water. In order for us to do this we will need a letter giving us written permission.

Your child will need to drink plenty throughout the day so a water bottle is a must, and these are filled with fresh water each day and refilled as required. We encourage the children to drink regularly, especially on warmer days, and their water bottles and fresh water is available at all times. Whenever possible we try to allow the children to have access both inside and out, providing shade and limiting the time they are exposed to the sun. On those rare, extremely hot days, we may make the decision to keep the children out of the sun, especially when the sun is at its strongest.
